There are different kinds of veterinarians too! Some care for farm animals, zoo animals, lizards and birds - every animal you can think of!




This is a story about a puppy's very first visit to the veterinarian. We need your help to colour the pages, in order to bring this story to life!

This is an important step in caring for Bailey's health and well-being now and in the future.



Bailey is excited to go meet some new friends!


Bailey is excited about the car ride to the veterinary clinic. At the clinic, his family will learn how to provide him with the best possible care.









This portrait of Bailey is unfinished...using the GRID below, will you draw in the mirror image to complete this portrait?






Kittens and cats need annual check-ups too! Both indoor and outdoor cats require special care to protect their health and keep them feeling frisky!


